B.A. Honours Course CBCS Syllabus for 6 Semesters

I. Discipline Core Course (DC)

1. Each one of the core courses shall carry 50 marks or 6 credits.
2. Each one of the core courses shall consist of two sections.
3. In the first section of a Core Course, students shall answer 4 Short Essay type questions taking one out of two from each of the four units, carrying 6 marks each in about 200 words each, and 4 short questions taking one out of two from each of the four units carrying 2 marks each in about 60 words each.
4. The second section shall consist of two components: Internal Assessment (I.A.) and Tutorial Component (T.C.). Students shall face a Contact Evaluation Test carrying a total of 18 marks (Class Attendance: 04 marks I.A.: 10 marks & T.C.: 08 marks).

II. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE)

1. Students shall opt for two DSE Courses out of three provided for each Semester.
2. Each one of the courses shall carry 50 marks or 6 credits.

3. Each one of the courses shall consist of two sections.

4. In the first section of a Discipline Specific Course, students shall answer 4 Short Essay type questions taking one out of two from each of the four units, carrying 6 marks each in about 200 words each, and 4 short questions taking one out of two from each of the four units carrying 2 marks each in about 60 words each.

5. The second section shall consist of two components: Internal Assessment (I.A.) and Tutorial Component (T.C.). Students shall face a Contact Evaluation Test carrying a total of 18 marks (Class Attendance: 04 marks I.A.: 10 marks & T.C.: 08 marks).

III. General Electives (GE)

IV. Ability Enhancement Compulsory (AEC)

(Semester II; Credits = 6; Total Marks = 50)

V. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Dewan Abdul Gani College offers the following Scholarships to ELIGIBLE & REGULAR students who are currently enrolled:

SVMCM Scholarship

The following eligibility criteria have been defined for **SVMCM Scholarship 2023**:

Upper Ceiling of Income:

- The upper ceiling for family income has been fixed at **₹250,000/- per annum**.

Educational Qualification:

- For Undergraduate courses (Arts/ Commerce/ Science/ Medical/ Other Professional Courses, UGC Approved): The candidates should have passed their class 12th or equivalent exam scoring a minimum of 60% marks in aggregate.
- For HS: The candidates need to pass the last qualifying exam scoring no less than 60% marks in aggregate.

Post-Matric Scholarship
for OBC/SC/ST Students (OASIS)

The following eligibility criteria have been defined for **Post-Matric Scholarship for OBS/ SC/ST Students**:

- The applicant should be an SC/ST/OBC student.
- The applicant should have passed the previous qualifying examination ((Class 11th or 12th) from a recognized board or university.
- Students from Post-graduation, M. Phil and Ph.D. are also eligible.
- The applicant's family income should not exceed **₹200,000/- per annum for SC/ST students and ₹100,000/- for OBC students.**

Aikyashree
(West Bengal State Scholarships for Minority Students)

The following eligibility criteria have been defined for **Aikyashree Scholarships for Minority Students**:

- A. For Pre-matric Scholarship, and
- B. Post-matric Scholarship
 - (i) The applicant must be **a domicile of West Bengal.**
 - (ii) The applicant must be studying in a school/institution recognized by an educational Board/Council/University of the State/Central Government.

- (iii) The applicant must have secured not less than 50% marks or equivalent grade in the previous examination.
- (iv) The annual family income should not exceed **₹200,000/- per annum**.
- (v) Students studying in institution outside West Bengal will not be eligible for pre-matric or post-matric scholarship.

C. For Merit-cum-Means Scholarship

- (i) The applicant must be a domicile of West Bengal.
- (ii) Must have got admission in a technical / professional course.
- (iii) Must have secured at least 50% marks in the last Higher Secondary / Graduation examination.
- (iv) The annual family income should not exceed **₹250,000/- per annum**.
- (v) Students, who are residents of West Bengal but are pursuing their studies in listed institutions located outside West Bengal, as may be notified from time to time by the **West Bengal Minorities Development and Finance Corporation**, are also eligible for applying.

SEMINAR HALL

1. No substitute holiday(s) shall be allowed for any initially notified holiday(s) if any of the festivals subsequently happens to fall on a weekly off day / any other non working day or in the event of more than one festival/occasion falling on the same day.
2. If there is any change in the date of the festivals / occasions, viz., Id-UI-Fitar, Id-Ud-Zoha (Bakrid), Muharram, Fateha-Dwaz-Daham and Sab-e-Barat, depending upon the sighting of the moon, holiday will be declared by separate order for the date on which the festival would be actually observed in lieu of the date originally notified as holiday for these festivals/occasions.

3. It may happen that the change of date of the above festivals / occasions has to be notified at a very short notice. In such a situation, announcement would be made through TV /A.I.R / Newspapers and the Heads of Department / Offices of the State Government may take action according to such announcements without waiting for formal order regarding the change of date.
